10:45 – 12:00 **OPEN SESSION - Broad Spectrum Sunscreen in the Prevention of UVA-induced photodermatosis**

Objectives:

UV radiation that reaches the surface of the earth consists of 95 % UVA and 5% UVB. While some beneficial effects of UVA have emerged therapeutically, in UVA photochemotherapy (PUVA) and in the treatment of sclerodermoid skin conditions, UVA has also been shown to induce erythema, photoaging changes and cellular damage.



Because UVA is present throughout the daylight hours, daily UVA protection is recommended.

This session takes a look at the effects of UVA rays and at the use of broad-spectrum sunscreen in the prevention of UVA-induced photodermatitis.

The burden of disease associated with psoriasis is well documented and has been shown to negatively impact psoriatic patients' physical and psychosocial well-being. As a chronic and life-ruining disease, there is a growing body of evidence indicating that psoriasis should be recognized as a chronic systemic inflammatory disorder and should be treated as such. There is a significant unmet clinical need in the management of long-term treatment of moderate to severe psoriasis, and compounding this is the fact that chronic inflammation has additional implications on organ systems other than the skin which can have impact on treatment choices. This symposium will address these implications and the necessity to consider long-term retention rate of various systemic therapies available to manage this chronic inflammatory skin disease.
